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2 1. PREFACE

3 Dear General Members' Assembly,

6 accomplish in the upcoming academic year. Over the past few months, the XVth board has worked on this

8 In the past years, SPiN has grown tremendously as an association. With the contribution of previous
9 boards and members who did their utmost to contribute to SPiN, the association has grown to be a solid
10 and professional study association. The XVth board is proud to continue this development and will do
11 their utmost to achieve the set goals.

12 This year, the XVth board has three main goals for the association: Hospitality, Personal Development,
13 and Involvement. The first goal for this academic year is Hospitality. Psychology is a study program with
14 lots of members from all around the world with different cultures. The board wants to make members
15 feel at home and try to connect people within the association. The second goal of this year is Personal
16 Development. The board wants SPiN to be a place where people can work on their personal
17 development by obtaining new connections and skills. The final goal of this academic year is
18 Involvement. The board wishes to strengthen each member's commitment to the association by
19 providing them with opportunities to feel involved with and appreciated by SPiN.

20 The board is looking forward to an extraordinary time. The XVth board is enthusiastic and eager to start a
21 wonderful year with all members of SPiN.

24 2. LUSTRUM

25 In this association year, SPiN will turn fifteen years old and thus celebrates her third lustrum. In the
26 academic year 2021-2022, a Lustrum committee was formed. This committee is in charge of organizing
27 the lustrum activities and will be continued this academic year. Two members of the XVth board will join
28 the Lustrum committee. The Lustrum committee will thus consist of ten people this year. Aside from the
29 Lustrum committee, another committee was formed for the lustrum, the Almanac committee. This
30 committee will also be continued. The Lustrum committee will be responsible for this year's gala as well
31 as several other formal and informal activities. The Almanac committee will create the almanac which
32 will temporarily replace the yearbook. Because the Lustrum and Almanac committee have taken on tasks
33 of other committees, some committees will be altered or inactive this year.

34 Together with the XIVth board and the Lustrum committee, the XVth board has decided to place all
35 lustrum activities within several weeks in April and May of 2023. This decision was based on the advice
36 of other lustrum boards who stated that their members reacted more positively about placing all lustrum
37 activities within a shorter period than having the activities take place throughout the association year.
38 Furthermore, the XVth board expects to be able to promote the lustrum better when the activities take
39 place within a shorter amount of time.

40 3. HOSPITALITY

41 Hospitality is the friendly and welcoming reception towards others. Over the past few years, SPiN has
42 grown into a beautiful association that sees a lot of different cultures and backgrounds. The XVth board
43 wants all members of SPiN to genuinely feel welcome in a place that might be very different from what
44 they are used to back home. The XVth board believes this can be realized by making SPiN more accessible
45 and creating a celebratory environment where people are given the opportunity to express themselves
46 and get to know others. As hospitality is a very broad topic, the XVth board wants to focus on the ways
47 that students feel invited within the association. Although SPiN is already a welcoming association to
48 many members who feel right at home, this is not the case for everyone as some might still feel a
49 threshold for getting to know SPiN better. These thresholds can either be because of functional or social
50 reasons. By implementing ideas in which these members will feel more represented and validated, these
51 thresholds can be lowered.

52 3.1 Culture committee

53 Within SPiN, there are a lot of members from different nationalities and backgrounds, who have
54 different and unique cultures. The XVth board wants to create an environment where people from
55 different cultures can not only feel at home but are also given the opportunity to express and celebrate
56 those cultures. To achieve this goal, the Culture committee will be created. For the composition of this
57 committee, the aim is to create a diverse committee with members from various nationalities. In the

58 activities organized by this committee, members can share and celebrate cultures together, which will
 59 connect people from different backgrounds. The committee has freedom in organizing the activities, as
 60 long as a specific culture or cultures are the central point of the activity, and participants can get an
 61 insight into the customs and habits of the cultures presented. The Culture committee will organize three
 62 activities throughout the year.

63 3.2 SPiN Website

64 The current website of SPiN was introduced during the board year of the IXth board. In the years
 65 following the release of the website, technology advanced at a rapid pace, which made it difficult to
 66 keep the website up to date. Furthermore, many web pages were not deleted or updated regularly,
 67 which could confuse members because of the misinformation on the website. A lot of pages also miss
 68 the English translation, or the site automatically switches back to Dutch. The XVth board wants to create
 69 a more appealing and user-friendly website, which should be a platform where future, present, and
 70 former members together with external parties can easily find information about several subjects. New
 71 members and external parties should feel invited to become involved with SPiN via the website. The XVth
 72 board wants to tackle these issues by creating a website taskforce. The objective of the task force is to
 73 make the website more inviting and easily accessible. They will first make a list of what should be
 74 improved and whether this can be achieved by improving the current website or by making an entirely
 75 new website. As a result of this list, the necessary parties, for example, different website providers, will
 76 be contacted about the costs and possibilities and compared with each other to see which fits best. At
 77 the biannual GMA, the taskforce will present which party is suited for tackling the website and what the
 78 costs will be. After the biannual GMA, the taskforce will go into business with the chosen party and
 79 finalise an agreement. The taskforce will consist of two members of the XVth board and former board
 80 members.

81 4. PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

82 Personal development refers to the personal and professional development of SPiN members and in
 83 what way SPiN can encourage this development. For many psychology students, their prospective career
 84 plays a big role in their daily life. Considering the choice of specific courses, the opportunities for
 85 domain-specific internships and other uncertainties, navigating through an academic career can be quite
 86 a challenge. The XVth board wants to help psychology students prepare for their future by providing
 87 opportunities for learning new skills and making connections. SPiN can be at the forefront of helping
 88 psychology students prepare for their professional future by providing services to members in different
 89 phases of their personal and professional development. The XVth board believes a broader target group
 90 will be reached and the association will fulfil a larger role when providing new services for helping
 91 students in their personal development.

92 4.1 Networking Committee

93 The XVth board wants to help SPiN's members develop on a professional level in as many ways as
 94 possible, so that they will not only profit from this in their present-day lives but in their later professional
 95 lives as well. As a study association, SPiN is in a position to provide her members with opportunities to
 96 do this during study-related activities. From expanding knowledge during lectures to gaining new
 97 experiences during excursions. Although these activities already provide students with a better
 98 perspective of various psychological work fields, the XVth board feels like these activities do not stimulate
 99 students enough to establish a real network of contacts within those work fields. Therefore, the XVth
 100 board wants to introduce the Networking committee. Next to being an extra opportunity to learn more
 101 about working in the psychological sector, this committee fills the gap for the students that have already
 102 done orientation and want to get more out of it. This could be the next step in investing in their future by
 103 connecting with the people from within their desired fields. More specifically, students will be able to
 104 make contacts in the workfield that may provide them with positions for internships and jobs, work
 105 experience, or letters of recommendation.

106 The Networking committee will organize one activity each semester with the main goal of developing
 107 interpersonal connections between students and professionals. During these activities, professionals
 108 from different psychological fields will be invited. The committee will have the freedom to decide how
 109 they want to fill in the activity itself but the XVth board suggests keeping these activities in a more
 110 'informal' setting. This is to really stimulate conversations instead of listening to formal presentations.
 111 Furthermore, a dedicated moment for exchanging contact information at the end of the activity is
 112 suggested as well as an opportunity for the professionals to advertise their company.

113 4.2 Skills 4 Skills

114 Over the years, SPiN has offered many opportunities to improve skills in study groups, workshops, or
 115 lectures. With Skills 4 Skills, the XVth board wants to propose a broader option to advance personal
 116 development. The goal of this intervention is to provide all members with an opportunity to come
 117 together and exchange knowledge and skills. Furthermore, it can increase and strengthen the connection
 118 between all members of the association.

119 It is planned that psychology students mention something they would feel confident in to explain to
 120 someone else, and in return, learn and improve desired skills themselves. These skills are not tied to a
 121 certain category but are open to a variety like studying, sports, or languages. To do so, they write their
 122 preferences on a piece of paper and put it on a corkboard. Additionally, members should indicate how
 123 they would like to be approached in case of a match, e.g., by their phone number, Instagram username,
 124 or asking a board member for their contact details. This information is placed on the backside of the
 125 sheet, so it is not accessible without removing the paper from the board to turn it around. The corkboard
 126 will be placed in a way that it can be seen from the board members in the SPiN room. This ensures a
 127 balance between people not feeling watched and supervision to prevent misuse. Participation in Skills 4

128 Skills will be promoted by a poster visible on the outside of the building, on social media, and in the e-
 129 mail newsletter. Additionally, the XVth board will ask for permission to inform students about Skills 4
 130 Skills via Brightspace and lecture talks. One board member will have the main responsibility for the
 131 intervention. This includes keeping track of the contents in a separate document, and manually matching
 132 people if a sheet is noticeably untouched for longer than one month. For this, holders of two matching
 133 cards are contacted via their indicated contact information and asked if they are interested in the
 134 exchange. After a trial period of six weeks, the responsible board member will report the development
 135 to the rest of the board. If participation is low, further possibilities will be discussed, such as more
 136 extensive promotion or adjusting the intervention. An additional feedback form is planned, where the
 137 participants can indicate their opinion and suggestions for improvements.

138 5. INVOLVEMENT

139 The term involvement refers to the presence of SPiN in its members' lives. It entails how approachable
 140 and relatable SPiN aspires to be for all her members. The XVth board believes that it is crucial that
 141 members identify with the organization and the causes that SPiN promotes. SPiN is there to support her
 142 members in stressful times as well as to relish the joyful moments together. The XVth board believes that
 143 if members feel more involved with the association, more members will become active, join activities,
 144 and work together for even more unforgettable memories. With the following interventions, the XVth
 145 board aims to strengthen the bond between the members and the association by giving them the
 146 opportunity to feel involved with and appreciated by SPiN.

147 5.1 Breakfast Club

148 A student's life can be stressful, fast-paced, and demanding. The XVth board wants to contribute to the
 149 well-being and care of its members. To help members cope with their stress throughout the study year,
 150 the XVth board wants to introduce the Breakfast Club. The Breakfast Club aims to provide the members
 151 with an opportunity to slow down, mellow out, and take a breath before the start of a new study
 152 period. The XVth board intends to achieve this goal by creating a slow-paced atmosphere in the SPiN
 153 common room where members can calmly sit down, conversate, and alleviate stress after a stressful
 154 exam period. To create this atmosphere, the XVth board will slightly alter the setup of the SPiN common
 155 room to make room for the bean bags and to have more space for the students to be able to sit down.
 156 To cancel out the harsh morning light, the blinds will be lowered, and soft lights will be installed
 157 throughout the SPiN room. Lastly, the usual upbeat SPiN common room music will be replaced by a
 158 calmer and more relaxing soundtrack. To aid the members further in their morning, the XVth board will
 159 prepare and supply a more diverse assortment of coffee and hot drinks. To create this more diverse
 160 assortment of coffee, a milk frother will be purchased. These drinks will be prepared beforehand by
 161 board members on the common grounds to be consumed in the SPiN common room. Apart from the
 162 offered drinks, the XVth board will also provide some breakfast snacks, e.g., croissants and fruits. There

163 will be three Breakfast Club days during the association year. Each Breakfast Club will be at the start of a
 164 new study period, so the members can have a fresh, calm start into the new period. The Breakfast Club
 165 will be starting at 10:00, so the coffee and breakfast snacks are prepared before the first class is over. To
 166 promote the Breakfast Club, a sign will be put up in the hallway telling all members to head inside for the
 167 activity. Additionally, the XVth board will go by lectures and make use of social media to promote the
 168 Breakfast Club in advance, and on the morning itself. The Breakfast club ends at 12:15 after which the
 169 cozy setting of the SPiN room will return to its usual state.

170 5.2 Flashback Friday

171 In the past years, SPiN's Instagram account "spin__stagram" has been increasingly used to promote
 172 activities and distribute information, even more so than other platforms (e.g., Facebook or the website).
 173 The XVth board wants to continue using Instagram as the main social media platform and further increase
 174 its engagement. Therefore, Flashback Friday will be introduced. Every other Friday, there will be a post
 175 on Instagram with photos of activities that have taken place in the previous two weeks. There will be an
 176 exception during or right after exam weeks and holidays because there are no activities during those
 177 times. During those weeks, there may be photos included from activities that took place longer ago. The
 178 XVth board believes that posting more photos of the activities on Instagram has the potential to not only
 179 make SPiN's Instagram page more diverse and appealing but also to promote future activities by showing
 180 how fun previous activities were, as looking back at an Instagram page only consisting of promotion does
 181 not capture the experience of an activity in the same way. The Media committee (which will be
 182 explained later in 8.2.3), which also takes the photos at activities, will be asked to select some photos of
 183 each activity which will be available for Flashback Friday. Furthermore, the members of the Media
 184 committee will be asked to write a short story of their experience of the activity, so that people can read
 185 individual experiences of members in the caption. The XVth board will post the final photos on Flashback
 186 Friday. The posts will also appear on the SPiN Facebook page.

187 5.3 Birthday Presents

188 The XVth board agrees with the introduction of birthday presents of the XIIth board to acknowledge and
 189 appreciate their connection with SPiN. With the advice of former boards and the prospective workload in
 190 mind, the XVth board decided to not attempt sending automatic e-mails with birthday wishes. As a
 191 present, the XVth board will arrange a birthday card, which includes a voucher from a bar of one of SPiN's
 192 main sponsor contracts. This will be a direct incentive for the members to head into the SPiN common
 193 room. Members can pick up their presents in the SPiN common room within two weeks of their birthday,
 194 excluding holidays. To promote members picking up their presents, social media and e-mail reminders
 195 via the newsletter will be used.

196 6. INTERNAL POLICY

197 6.1 Workload

198 This year, the third lustrum of SPiN will take place, which could lead to unforeseen fluctuations in the
199 workload throughout the year. There will be two internal affairs officers this year, which reduces the
200 number of committees the other board members should supervise and reduces the general workload of
201 all board members.

202 6.2 The SPiN common room

203 This year, the XVth board will open the SPiN common room during the same hours as the XIth, XIIth, and
204 XIVth board. The room will be open from 10:15 until 14:30 from Mondays to Thursdays. On Fridays and
205 during the exam- and resit periods, the SPiN room will be opened from 10:15 until 13:30. This decision
206 was based on the advice of the XIVth board. Furthermore, during holidays, the room will be closed.
207 During trips, there will be different opening hours than usual which will be announced throughout the
208 academic year.

209 6.3 Personal Development of board members

210 Just like in previous years, the chair will have at least two personal development plan interviews with
211 each board member. The vice chair will conduct the development plan interview with the chair.
212 Following the example of the XIVth board, the XVth board will also have multiple small chair talks during
213 the year. These are informal and brief talks between the chair and the other board members. These
214 small chair talks will take place regularly. Additionally, taking after the examples of previous boards,
215 there will be feedback rounds and each member of the XVth board will have an individual coach. Just as
216 in previous years, it will be mandatory for every board member to meet with their coach at least once at
217 the beginning of the year. After that, it will be optional to meet with their coach throughout the rest of
218 the year.

219 6.4 Administration

220 6.4.1 Privacy

221 The XIIth board had planned on making the transition to Edugroepen, which was not pursued. Last year,
222 the university switched to Microsoft 365. However, the OneDrive of the association is currently not
223 under the license of the university. The XVth board will continue the use of OneDrive this year, keep up to
224 date with new information, and follow the procedure of the university.

225 6.4.2 Event Promotion

226 Promotion of the activities is important for SPiN. For that reason, the XIVth board made a fixed
 227 promotion schedule for the promotion of activities. At the beginning of each month, an overview of all
 228 the activities for that month will be posted and the ticket sale for every activity will start two weeks
 229 before the activity. The XVth board wants to continue this. The first promotion will be one day in advance
 230 of the ticket sale at 13:00. This is a change from last year, in which the first promotion and the ticket sale
 231 were on the same day. The XVth board thinks that it is favourable to have more time between the first
 232 promotion and the ticket sale. If an activity is on a Monday, the first promotion will be on the Friday
 233 before the ticket sale, so 16 days in advance of the activity. Furthermore, a reminder and a link to the
 234 ticket sale will be posted via an Instagram story on the day of the ticket sale. The ticket sale will open at
 235 19:00. The XVth board will try out ClubCollect for the first activities and, if the trial goes well, possibly
 236 switch from Eventix to ClubCollect regarding the ticket sale. As in previous years, the XVth board will
 237 mainly use Instagram, Facebook, and a SPiNnouncement WhatsApp group to promote activities.

238 6.4.3 Lay-out change official documents

239 The XVth board wants to implement a new lay-out for official documents presented at general
 240 members' assemblies, such as policies and budget proposals. The new lay-out will be designed
 241 in such a way that the SPiN logo on the background will less interfere with the text. Furthermore
 242 the (sub)headings will be altered so there is more room for the text on every page. The XVth
 243 board wants to implement these changes to modernize the representation of the association
 244 and to make the text more appealing and easier to read.

245 7. COMMITTEES

246 7.1 Roles within committees

247 The roles within committees consist of the positions of chair, vice-chair, secretary, treasurer, and
 248 promotion officer. The other committee members with no specific function are appointed as 'general
 249 members'. Concerning the positions of chair, vice-chair, secretary, treasurer, and promotion officer, the
 250 XVth board will provide training.

251 The vice-chair will be responsible for the social contact between committees. This means that the vice-
 252 chair is responsible for organizing committee-committee dates and committee-board dates. This was set
 253 up by the XIIIth board and continued by the XIVth board. The XVth board wants to continue this as well.
 254 Besides the social aspect, the vice-chair will also be responsible for finding committee members who will
 255 go to the GMA's. Just as in previous years, the XVth board thinks it is important that at least one member
 256 of every committee is present at every GMA. Giving the vice-chair this responsibility will help to achieve
 257 this goal.

258 To improve the communication between the committees and the Illustration committee, the XIVth board
 259 decided to make every member of the Illustration committee the contact person for a certain number of
 260 committees. Apart from that, they made the contact between the Illustration committee and promotion
 261 officers more accessible, for instance via WhatsApp instead of mail. The XVth board wants to continue
 262 this. The poster request and final poster will still be sent via mail.

263 For the supporting committees (GMA committee, Financial Audit committee, the Acquisition committee,
 264 and the Illustration committee) a treasurer and promotion officer are not required, as these committees
 265 do not have a budget and do not need promotion. Regarding the GMA committee, the XVth board will be
 266 responsible for the promotion of the GMA. Because the GMA committee and Financial Audit committee
 267 only consist of two persons, no vice-chair will be appointed to these committees.

268 Within the acquisition committee, two spots will be available for international members, which were
 269 implemented by the XIIth board and continued by the XIIIth board and XIVth board.

270 The committees are open to Dutch and international students. This also applies in the GMA's. These will
 271 be held in English, so both Dutch and international members can attend. However, following the
 272 procedure of previous boards, a proficient level of Dutch is required for the function of the technical
 273 chair, since members might ask questions and give comments in Dutch. Additionally, the technical chair
 274 should be adequate to translate questions from English to Dutch and the other way around.

275 7.2 Changes

276 7.2.1 Cancelled committees

277 The XVth board will remove two committees, as they have become redundant for this year. The first is
 278 the Gala committee and the second is the Sophomore committee.

279 The Gala committee will be cancelled for one year since a gala will already be organized as part of the
 280 lustrum this year. The XVth board expects, however, that the XVIth board will add the Gala committee
 281 again in their board year.

282 The Sophomore committee was added by the XIVth board to give the students who only had an online
 283 introduction and online classes an opportunity to meet each other during offline activities. As the first-
 284 year students of 2021-2022 luckily did have chances to meet their fellow freshmen in real life from the
 285 start of the year on, the XVth board feels that the need for a Sophomore committee has passed.

286 7.2.2 Added committees

287 This year, the XVth board will introduce two new committees. The first committee is the Culture
 288 committee (see 3.1). This committee will organize activities that include and celebrate the many
 289 different cultures within the psychology programme. This committee will organize two small activities
 290 and one big activity. The second committee is the Networking committee (see 4.1). This committee will
 291 organize activities with the main purpose of creating a social network of professional contacts. This
 292 committee will organize two activities, one in each semester.

293 **7.2.3 Changed committees/ Activities**

294 The XVth board has decided to make changes to three committees: the Media & Yearbook committee,
295 the Lecture committee, and the Festivities committee.

296 The Media & Yearbook committee will be changed to the Media committee since there will not be a
297 yearbook this year, but an almanac instead. Instead of a yearbook, the Media committee will get the
298 extra task of preparing the photos and captions for Flashback Fridays on SPiN's social media (see 5.3).

299 The Lecture committee will organize only four lectures instead of five, as one lecture will already be a
300 part of this year's lustrum.

301 The Festivities committee, usually in charge of the Insomnia party and the Dies celebration, will only
302 focus on the Insomnia party this year, as this year there are the lustrum weeks instead of the Dies to
303 celebrate SPiN's birthday. Therefore, the XVth board wants to make the Insomnia committee a half-year
304 committee this year.

305 **7.3 Overview of committees**

306 **7.3.1 Committees related to work field and study**

307 *Lecture committee*

308 This committee will organize four lectures of which one will be a collaboration with TOEP. This is a
309 change from last year when the lecture committee organized five lectures.

310 *Networking committee*

311 This committee will organize two networking activities.

312 *Orientation committee*

313 This committee will organize Experience Your Future in collaboration with SPS-NIP.

314 *Workfield & Future committee*

315 This committee will organize four excursions and the Masters' evening.

316 *Workshop & Conference committee*

317 This committee will organize three workshops and a conference.

318 **7.3.2 Non-study-related committees**

319 *Culture committee*

320 This committee will organize three cultural-focused activities, of which two small and one big.

321 *Freshmen committee*

322 This committee consists of only freshmen and organizes its activities for freshmen only. This committee
323 will organize three activities of which one is a barbecue.

324 *Festivities committee*

325 This committee will organize one Insomnia party. This is a change from last year in which the committee
326 organized the Insomnia party and the Dies celebration. This committee is a half-year committee.

327 *Initiative committee*

328 This committee will organize six theme days. In addition, this committee provides eight exam deals.

329 *Integration committee*

330 This committee will organize three activities to allow students to integrate with fellow students and/or
331 teachers. These activities concern the Freshmen weekend, one student-teacher activity, and one activity
332 of choice.

333 *Lustrum committee*

334 This committee is responsible for organizing the celebrations of the third lustrum of SPiN. The committee
335 will organize one gala, one lecture, a lustrum party and three activities of choice.

336 *Party & Drinks committee*

337 This committee will organize five theme parties and three drinks.

338 *SocialCie*

339 This committee will organize three activities for active members only. These activities concern the Active
340 Members' Weekend and two activities of choice.

341 *SocioCultural committee*

342 This committee will organize one big and two small activities of choice.

343 *Sports committee*

344 This committee will organize three sports activities of which one is the 'Batavierenrace'.

345 **7.3.3 Trip committees**

346 *City trip committee*

347 This committee will organize a city trip and one day trip.

348 *Ski trip committee*

349 This committee will organize a ski trip.

350 *Study trip committee*

351 This committee will organize a study trip. Parts of this trip are study-related, cultural, and social
352 activities.

353 7.3.4 Media committees

354 *Almanac committee*

355 This committee will be responsible for making the Lustrum almanac.

356 *Magazine committee*357 This committee will publish four editions of the magazine 'HersenSPiNsels'. Every edition will have 50
358 copies.359 *Media committee*360 This committee will take or receive pictures of several activities and organize the storage of these
361 pictures. These pictures will be used for the 'Flashback Fridays' on SPiN's social media. The committee
362 will choose the pictures and write the captions for the 'Flashback Fridays'.

363 7.3.5 Supporting committees

364 *Acquisition committee*365 This committee is responsible for all the acquisitions. Together with the External Affairs Officer, the
366 committee will look for sponsorships, discounts, and handle sponsorship requests of committees.367 *GMA committee*368 GMA stands for General Members' Assembly. This committee is, in cooperation with the board,
369 responsible for organizing the General Members' Assembly. The committee consists of a technical chair
370 and a technical secretary.371 *Illustration committee*372 This committee will be responsible for making posters, flyers, banners, and the covers of the
373 'HersenSPiNsels' throughout the year.

374 7.3.6 Association institutions

375 *Financial Audit committee*

376 The Financial Audit committee is the body that controls the association's accounting.

377 *Advisory Council*

378 The Advisory Council is a supportive point of contact for the board in case of questions or problems.

379 They may give solicited or unsolicited advice to the board.

380 8. EXTERNAL POLICY

381 8.1 Sponsorship

382 This association year, the XVth board strives to raise €7375 in sponsorship money. This will be done by
383 fixed contracts and general sponsorship.

384 8.1.1 Fixed contracts

385 This association year, SPiN will be receiving a minimum of €875 from her sponsors De Waagh, Café de
386 Fuik and Drie Gezusters.

387 SPiN will organize a constitution drink and the GMAs at De Waagh, who will in turn sponsor SPiN €500.

388 Three drinks will be organized at Café de Fuik which will result in €375 in sponsorship money. For every
389 out-of-contract drink organized at Café de Fuik, SPiN will receive €125. SPiN will receive €150 for each
390 party that will take place at Drie Gezusters and each drink will result in €75.

391 The XVth board expects to receive €4750 from Athena by selling summaries in the SPiN common room
392 and online. Furthermore, the XVth board expects to receive €1000 from Athena for selling their exam
393 training. The XVth board expects to receive a total of €5750 from Athena.

394 In total, SPiN will obtain a minimum of €6625 from her fixed contracts. The XVth board expects that SPiN
395 will receive a total of €7075 from her fixed contracts and bars due to bonus arrangements.

396 8.1.2 General sponsoring

397 Aside from the sponsorship money SPiN will receive from her fixed contracts, the XVth board will strive to
398 obtain €300 for general sponsoring through advertisement and vacancies of external parties.

399 8.2 SPiN-discount

400 In addition to continuing existing collaborations, the XVth board will, together with the Acquisition
401 committee, search for new collaborations.

402 8.3 Athena

403 The XVth board has revised the agreement with Athena. Athena offers summaries of almost all bachelor
404 courses, exam training, and bachelor thesis guidance. SPiN will receive 7,5% of the net turnover from the
405 summaries sold in the SPiN common room or online, with a minimum sponsorship of €2000.

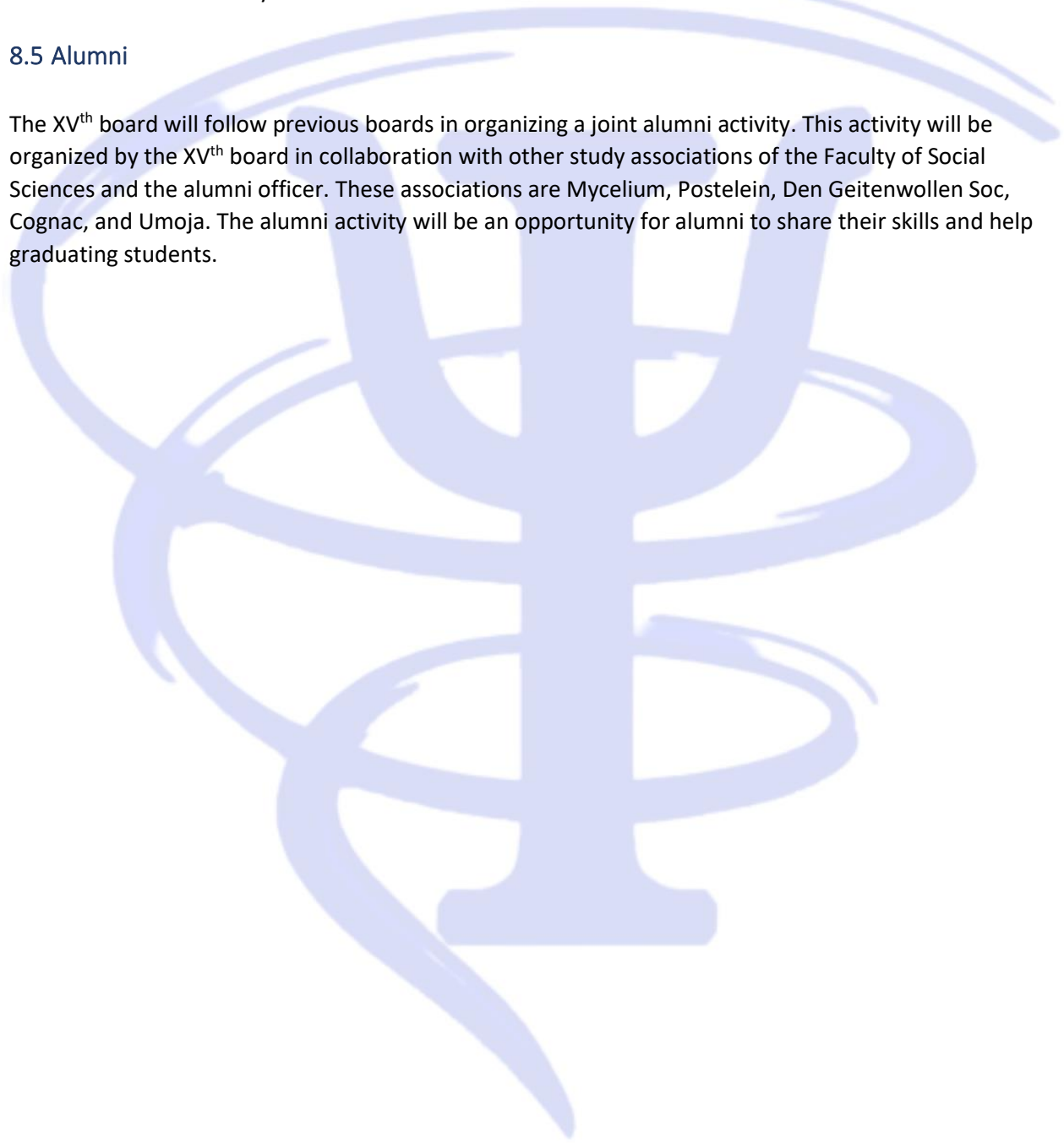
406 Furthermore, SPiN will receive 5% of the turnover from the exam training when the discount code is
407 used, with a minimum sponsorship of €1000. Each time a discount code is used for the bachelor thesis
408 guidance, SPiN will receive €10. The contract will last until September 1st, 2023. The contract will be
409 tacitly renewed every year if both parties do not terminate the contract. SPiN receives 5% of the entire
410 net turnover from AthenaStudies Psychology at Nijmegen, with a minimum sponsorship of €1000.

411 8.4 Book contracts

412 SPiN will have a contract with Studystore for at least a year. Studystore is the book supplier for the
413 literature of all bachelor years and some master courses as well. SPiN obtains 6% of the sales revenue.

414 8.5 Alumni

415 The XVth board will follow previous boards in organizing a joint alumni activity. This activity will be
416 organized by the XVth board in collaboration with other study associations of the Faculty of Social
417 Sciences and the alumni officer. These associations are Mycelium, Postelein, Den Geitenwollen Soc,
418 Cognac, and Umoja. The alumni activity will be an opportunity for alumni to share their skills and help
419 graduating students.



420 9. EPILOGUE

421 Dear General Members' Assembly,

422 In the previous pages, the policy of the association year 2022-2023 has been presented to you. In this
423 proposed policy, the focal points were Hospitality, Personal Development, and Involvement.424 The XVth board hopes that the interventions stated in this policy will make each member of SPiN feel that
425 they are being heard and involved within the association. A lot of SPiN's members use their leisure time
426 and cultural knowledge to broaden the association's horizon and with that comes the responsibility to
